

**SACRED HEART SCHOOL SCIENCE FAIR
HOW TO ASSEMBLE YOUR DISPLAY BOARD**

Your child will be provided with a heavy poster board; however, you may also need markers, pencils, ruler/yardstick, scissors, eraser, and glue. Letter stencils to trace around would also work nicely for making the title.

The display board should be arranged as follows: (See attached example)

TITLE	Should be across the top center panel of the board in bold print. It can be in question form, or the project can have a short catchy title.
PROBLEM/PURPOSE	The top center panel section is the place to write in the scientific question.
HYPOTHESIS	Should be displayed in the bottom center of the same panel as the problem.
PROCEDURES	The left portion of the display should contain a description of the procedure used in carrying out the project.
RESULTS	The top right panel section should list the results based upon the project's collected data. This could be in the form of charts or graphs.
CONCLUSIONS	The bottom right panel section should state the conclusions.
PROJECT WRITE UP FORM	The Project Write up Form must be included with the display board.

Outline the project on the board. It is a good idea to block everything in pencil first. Then, once the display is in its final form, a marker can be used.

Go over everything, check spelling, grammar, punctuation, content, and clarity. Be sure to involve your child in each of these processes as each serves to reinforce language skills.

Avoid using fancy lettering, borders, or elaborate pictures. Do have neat, accurate charts and graphs.

The name and grade of the student(s) should be printed neatly on the bottom right-hand corner of the board.
