Special Collection for Ukraine Humanitarian Effort: My personal thanks to all who gave from their hearts to this special collection and to all who offered prayers to God for the suffering and tragedy inflicted upon innocent people. The world is at another difficult moment in the history of peoples. **Please pray to Almighty God for divine intervention.**

Archbishop's Call to Share: As of March 18, 2022, 102 households of Sacred Heart Catholic Church have donated/pledged \$34,220.00 to the Archbishop's campaign, and we are \$3,780 from reaching the target goal of \$38,000. Interview Search Committee: Two candidates have applied for the position of principal of Sacred Heart Catholic Grade School. From the Liturgy Committee on Dress for the Assembly at Mass: Members in the assembly proclaim the living presence of Christ both verbally and nonverbally. The central focus of the mass is the sacred presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Please consider dressing simply, appropriately, and modestly out of reverence and respect for God.

Knowing your faith: What does it mean to be a “practicing Catholic”?: A practicing Catholic in “good standing” with the Roman Catholic Church is obliged to follow *the precepts or norms of life as a faithful Catholic*, by participating fully in the sacramental life of the Church and understanding and accepting the teachings of the Church and the moral demands of the Gospel, *as articulated in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC, n. 2042-2043)*.

Synodal Consultation Sessions: March 23rd & 24th , Wednesday and Thursday) from 6:30 pm – 8:00 pm, and March 26th 10:30 am – 12:00 Noon. All meetings are held in the Parish Center. “Synod means ‘journeying together’ and it involves listening to the Holy Spirit and to each other [to] discern the path we are called to walk together... Pope Francis wants to hear what is happening in local parishes (from Leadership Roundtable).

Archdiocesan Ethics Advisory Council: The following statements were shared with members on the council with me and Archbishop Naumann at the March 8th Wednesday and the rulings pertain to “ **Value Them Both**”:

Below are the laws that were passed but that have now been struck down. There is a chance that IF we pass VTB, we can possibly appeal these decisions?? The Live-Dismemberment Abortion Procedure is referred to as "Dilation and Evacuation" (D&E) by the abortion industry. They like to use these phrases that hide what they are actually doing.

2011: H Sub SB 36: *Abortion clinic licensing and inspection. KDHE to regulate facilities with surprise inspections, reports of complications and deaths; all abortions be done by Kansas-licensed physician with hospital privileges within 30 miles of clinic, bans “webcam” abortions. Opponents included Planned Parenthood and Trust Women. Senate: 24-15 House: 97-26*

2015: 19) SB 95: *Live Dismemberment Abortion Ban. Opponents included abortion providers Hodes & Nauser, Planned Parenthood, Trust Women, South Wind abortion facility, and the ACLU. Senate: 31-9 House: 98-26 Law was sued by Hodes & Nauser and held under temporary injunction, upheld by Kansas*

Court of Appeals. In 2019, the Kansas Supreme Court issued a decision that found a right to abortion in the state Constitution and sent the case back to District Court for review using strict scrutiny standard. In 2021, the Shawnee County District court declared the law unconstitutional under the new strict scrutiny standard, becoming the first Kansas law that regulates abortion to fall in the new legal landscape. It is considered the first of many in a state with unregulated, unrestricted abortion without a Constitutional amendment to preserve the existing laws. 20) S Sub HB 2228: Clarifies hospital protocol of abortion drugs, to allow webcam abortion.

Guidelines from the Archdiocese for the Pastoral Council:

Establishment

Canon 536.1 states, "If, after consulting the council of priests, the diocesan Bishop considers it opportune, a pastoral council is to be established in each parish. In this council, which is presided over by the parish priest, Christ's faithful, together with those who by virtue of their office are engaged in pastoral care in the parish; give their help in fostering pastoral action."

Function

The pastoral council is established to serve as a consultative group to the pastor, to assist him in fostering pastoral activities and in providing for the continued growth of parish life.

Areas of Service

The pastoral council is established to assist the pastor in reaching out in service to his people; the areas of parish life listed in Canon 528-529 are its special concerns. They include, but are not limited to; the spiritual formation and growth of the people of the parish in liturgical celebrations; the education of adults and youth in the faith; the fostering and nurturing of "community" in the parish; the evangelization of the non-participating Catholics in the parish; witnessing to the Gospel of social justice in one's community through service; pastoral planning; review, evaluate and make recommendations to the pastor and the finance council concerning the funding of parish programs.

Membership

The pastor will choose a Selection Chairperson who will invite other parishioners to serve in the selection process of persons to be chosen by parishioners to serve on the pastoral council. Any parishioners may submit names to the Selection Chairperson for consideration. The pastor has the right to approve all names to be presented to the parishioners for their selection.

Information concerning all persons to be presented by the Selection Chairperson to the parishioners for their selection is to be published in the parish bulletin or otherwise made known to the parishioners.

The selection of the parishioners may be by election, or another method approved by the parishioners. If an election is the method chosen, the time and place is to be duly publicized, and voting will be by secret ballot. If another method of selection is chosen, the details of the selection process are to be made known to the parishioners so all may participate.
